Epidural anaesthesia during labour What is an epidural? An epidural is a medical procedure that can be used to control pain in labour (childbirth or having a baby). It is a thin plastic tube that is put in through the skin between the bones of your lower back.

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Epidural anaesthesia during labour

Analgesia is established and maintained throughout labor and delivery using 0.125% bupivacaine with fentanyl 2 µg/ml with patient-controlled epidural analgesia by means of a continuous epidural infusion (8 ml/h basal rate) and patient-controlled boluses (3 ml each) with 20-minlock-out intervals, continued at the same bolus dose until delivery.

Failed Epidural Anesthesia During Labor: Evaluation of ...

Labour epidurals are popular and safe; they provide effective analgesia for labouring parturients. Lower dose epidural regimes limit motor block, do not affect progress of labour, and have minimal side effects to mother and fetus. Labour epidurals can also be used to provide anaesthesia for assisted vaginal delivery or caesarean section.

The Labour Epidural: The Basics

Labor analgesia was initiated using a combined spinal-epidural technique with an intrathecal injection of bupivacaine 2.5 mg and fentanyl 15 µg, and an epidural test dose of 1.5% lidocaine with epinephrine 5 µg/ml (3 ml). An epidural catheter was sited and analgesia was maintained using patient-controlled epidural analgesia (PCEA).

Neuraxial analgesia or neuraxial anaesthesia here refer to any epidural, spinal or combined spinal-epidural (CSE) performed for an obstetric indication. The latter may include analgesia during labour, or analgesia/anaesthesia for operative delivery or for other obstetric indications, for example, insertion of a cervical suture in the ...

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Epidural anesthesia has been administered most commonly for procedures involving the lower limbs, pelvis, perineum, and lower abdomen but is increasingly being used as the sole anesthetic or as a complement to GA for a greater diversity of

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procedures.

Motor block may be more extensive when performing lumbar epidural anaesthesia because of the spatial proximity of motor fibres. 35 In labour, low-dose epidural analgesia may be associated with fewer operative vaginal deliveries. 63 The use of a smaller dose in a higher volume has therefore been advocated for obstetric analgesia. 64

It's used to manage postoperative pain, procedural pain, trauma pain, or labor pain. While epidural analgesia is used to manage pain, epidural anesthesia is used to provide anesthesia during labor and delivery and surgical procedures.

For improved postoperative analgesia after cesarean delivery during epidural anesthesia, the literature supports the use of epidural opioids compared with intermittent injections of intravenous or intramuscular opioids.

The possibility of the delayed onset of a spinal epidural hematoma in a pregnant woman who undergoes epidural anaesthesia in labour must always be taken into consideration. In order to achieve the best clinical result, we stress the importance of a timely diagnosis and prompt surgical treatment.

Different modality of anesthesia and analgesia could influence a postoperative quality of recovery (QoR). This study is exploring early QoR after unilateral nephrectomy in the two groups of anesthesia. The first group had a light general anesthesia with thoracic epidural anesthesia and postoperative epidural analgesia with morphine and ropivacaine.

Persistent headache in the days after labor epidural analgesia is a nonspecific clinical symptom caused by hematoma. Preexisting vascular malformations can be a concomitant cause of headache. Clinical cases have been reported even after epidural anesthesia.

Epidural Guidelines - Ether - Resources for Anesthesia ...

There are typically three pharmacological choices for labour analgesia in Nova Scotia hospitals offering obstetrical services. These include: epidural, intravenous or intramuscular opioids and inhaled nitrous oxide. The availability of all three options is dependent on site-specific resources.

Epidural labor analgesia is strongly associated with an increased risk of cesarean delivery for dystocia. Whether epidural use, like severe labor pain, merely serves as a marker for dystocia or actually causes dystocia is an open question with great public health consequences.

Epidural Labor Analgesia and the Incidence of Cesarean

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Current labour epidural infusions consist of a low concentration of local anaesthetic plus low dose narcotic and it is expected that parturients may feel contractions as a pressure sensation. Pain thresholds and response to local anaesthesia can vary between individuals and also between different labour processes and fetal positions.

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
